

## CAMEROON – HORIZONS OF HOPE CRUSADES More than 5000 people baptized


This is the result of evangelism efforts made from March 5 to April 1, 2017. The Seventh-day Adventist Church in Cameroon, supported by the West-Central Africa region (WAD) workers got involved in the harvest of souls. It was a wonderful experience of evangelism with the concept total "membership involvement".

From the North to the South, from the East to the West, it was the same theme: Horizons of Hope. The personnel

of the West-Central Africa Division (WAD) and the

Cameroon Union Mission staff have covered the territory. Under the supervision of Dr. Same Vincent, Director of Evangelization at WAD, and the coordination of Pastor Jean Pourrat Meting, his collaborator in Cameroon, preachers came from the offices of the WAD in Abidjan (Côte d'Ivoire), Lomé in Togo and Lagos in Nigeria.

Preaching during a crusade was the very first experience for Eto Samson, the fleet leader of the Seventh-day Adventist Church





This worker has totaled more than 20 years of service and it is the very first time that he is involved in the missionary activity. He was not the only one. Many were in their first experience. In the end, all felt more impressed in their intimacy with God. As Pastor Koch would put it: "the most important thing remains prayer and communion with God."

The experience spread to the entire territory of Cameroon with the mobilization of nearly three thousand small groups.

Preparations have followed the principles embodied in the concept of *Total Membership* **Involvement** (TMI). Health programs, free consultations, donations of blood to hospitals during the Global Youth Day, home visits, assistance to the needy, bible studies in small groups, all these aimed at preparing the people to meet Christ.

At the end of the program, Pasteur Meting, who is responsible for evangelism in Cameroon, is amazed: "The Horizons of Hope campaigns gave us the opportunity to realize the real value of the 'Total Membership Involvement' initiative. Approximately 3,800 evangelistic sites were able to operate simultaneously. We had 511 public sites and approximately 3,300 small groups.

The results speak for themselves: 5,042 baptisms already recorded. It is a big first time in our union. Glory be to God!" This performance is almost equivalent to the results of the whole 2016 year.

To baptize in a river. For some, this is not a commonplace fact. This is the case with Pastor Irineo Koch in the closing of Bonaberi's evangelistic campaign in Douala, the coastal city and economic capital of Cameroon, one of the hardest, most resistant cities to the gospel message. But God has allowed hundreds of souls to follow Jesus in this part of Cameroon.

"I was amazed at this ceremony of baptism in a great river" said Pastor Koch.

The Church can still do better. Pastor Badu James, one of the preachers from the WAD headquarters, made an evaluation of the mobilization in East Cameroon: "The members were well involved. They could have invited more listeners to public sites." The effort in this part of Cameroon has produced more than two thousand baptisms and a little more than a thousand backslidden came back to Church. Mrs Sessou Omobonike and Pastor Same Vincent Roger have made their contribution in the building of these results respectively in Batouri and Bertoua for a couple of weeks.

Wonderful conversions: An astounding conversion of a young Imam and his wife impressed the Church in Douala. The two were baptized in Douala. Two weeks before the campaigns, the man read and studied the Bible in Arabic, secluded in his room. At the end of these two weeks, he received the invitation for the Horizons of Hope campaigns. Evening after evening, all his questions were answered to his full amazement.

Convinced of the truth, he talked about it to his wife who followed him in this way. Eventually both of them decided to follow Jesus. This is when persecution begins. Deprived of the essentials, this couple received spontaneous help from Church members for their resettlement. For now, their security remains a real concern. Nevertheless, the new convert, trained in Saudi Arabia, is ready to preach the Gospel to the Muslims.

In Yaounde, another Muslim of Malian origin baptized against all odds. Pastor Elie Weick-Dido, leader of the Adventist Church in West-Central Africa, was the preacher of the site where the young Muslim student responded. He encouraged the young lady to stand firm. The latter will say all her happiness when she came out of the baptismal waters of Djoungolo 2: "I am very delighted and very happy. It's the best day of my life. For others, it is marriage. But for me, my baptism is the most beautiful day. I am united to Jesus by His grace."



The joy of such an experience could not be hidden. The harvest continues. Pastor Same Vincent hopes that this interimreport will increase due to other baptisms in sight in April 2017. Depending on the trends of the visitors' responses to the various appeals, the figures could reach 7,000.

All the preachers returned with hearts full of joy and eager to repeat again and again such involvement in the mission. Pastor Stephen Bindas, Vice President of WAD and preacher at one of the sites in Yaoundé, did not hide his satisfaction when he left Cameroonian soil at Nsimalen airport: "I welcome this new vision of the administration of Our Church. It is really good to leave our offices and to scrutinize the realities of the ground, to carry out the mission. There was only one word: unity in action, unity in the total membership involvement.

The Adventist Church in Cameroon has just been established a Union Mission in 2014 and has just under 100,000 members in nearly 1,500 churches and companies. There are 163 pastoral workers. In the midst of the social crises and the war against the bloodthirsty sect Boko Haram, the Adventist Church in Cameroon faces colossal challenges. Hence the importance of the TMI initiative in order to achieve the goal of doubling the membership by 2020.




#### The Adventist Youth Hailed As A Model

The Minister of Youth Affairs and Civic Education of Cameroon congratulates the Young Adventists (AY) for their noble discipline. It was during the annual festivities marking the National Youth Day on February 8, 2017 in Yaounde, capital city of Cameroon.

That day was dense in the city of Yaounde. The Indomitable Lions recently returned from their victorious African Cup of Nations football trip from Libreville (Gabon). The President of the Republic, Paul Biya and the populations welcomed and celebrated those heroes with pomp. It was in this festive atmosphere that the village of youth installed at the Multipurpose Sports Center of Yaoundé (PAPOSY) flowed its activities. The young Adventists were solicited there. In their outfits, adventurers, explorers and Master guides ensured security, welcome and even orientation to the thousands that come to visit.



Fervor was visible. At least five members of the government witnessed the panel discussion on "Religion and civic education of young people". All the religious leaders of Cameroon were invited. The prominent Cardinal Christian Tumi represented the Catholic Church.



Pastor Assembe Valère Guillaume represented the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Cameroon and a large audience of other religious leaders listened to these exchanges, attended by nearly 5,000 people. From the start, the AYs executed the national anthem with such brilliance that the hall was raised with admiration. The score was well assimilated. They came back with this impressive parade that forced the admiration and standing ovation of the government authorities and the general public.

Minister Mounouna Foutsou in charge of Youth Affairs and Civic Education has not failed to express his admiration to the young Adventists: "I found you well disciplined and different from the other children. You are models on which Cameroon counts to shape a dependable youth." One of the speakers, Professor Jean Emmanuel Pondi, praised these young people: "I have noticed you. You were calm and you took notes of everything that was said. You were not like the others."

Shaking hands with the Director of the Youth Ministries for the Cameroon Union Mission, Dr. Assam Assam Jean Paul, he renewed his appreciation. The hundred young people present were satisfied and pleased to have distributed Adventist literature to all the participants. That was real Total Member Involvement.

The National Youth Day and the May 20th National Unity Day are the two biggest national mobilization opportunities. The Youth Day holds on February 11 and is preceded by a whole week of activities in schools and universities.

Conferences, competitions, career counseling, sports competitions, and many other activities mark these very popular festivities across the country.

The fifty-first edition of this year 2017 is to be feted in a precarious socio-political context, exacerbated by many problems such as the desecration of emblems, violence, illegal immigration,

delinquency, immorality, idleness, pauperism ...

The President of the Republic, Paul Biya, during his traditional address to the youth on February 10, 2013, urged the religious groups. He said "our churches, temples and mosques have to become true schools of civility, rigor and morality". With all this in mind, the Ministry of Youth and Civic Education organizes a series of activities throughout the national territory mobilizing religious leaders in order to involve them in promoting the values of citizenship, Ethics and morality, the culture of peace and harmonious living together.

According to the 2010 statistics, more than half of Cameroon's population is under 17 years of age. The age pyramid reflects the extreme youth of the Cameroonian population. This reality is also that of the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Cameroon, which has more than 70% of its membership very young. The nation counts on this youth to impact the national project of civic rearmament.

# First General Assembly of the Togo Conference



After 53 years of existence, the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Togo from a Mission status moved to that of a Conference.

The Assembly that sanctioned the process that led to the Conference took place from the 4th to the 7th of January 2017 in Lomé. This gathering recorded 110 delegates from both Togo Mission and the territory of the Western Sahel Union Mission.

Attended this meeting also, the West-Central Africa Division represented by Pastor Elie Weick, President of this Institution, Pastor Kingsley Anonaba, Executive Secretary, Elder Emmanuel Manu, Treasurer and Pastor Same Vincent, Sabbath School/Personal Ministries/Evangelism Director, Pastor James Badu, SP/TS Dev, Director, Mrs. Omobonike Sessou, Women and Children Ministries Director and Pastor Sessou Selom from the Secretariat, Human Resources Director.

The outcome of the Assembly's work led to the election of Pastor Gameti Kwasi, Pastor Enyonam Agbedigue and Brother Joseph Agbodouamenou, respectively as President, Executive Secretary

and Treasurer for this newly erected Conference. A new team of 13 departmental directors and 15 committee members was also set up to lead out the activities of the Conference.

The launching of this new Conference took place on Sabbath, 7th of January 2017, at the Palais des Congrès of Lomé were more than 3000 Church members and special guests from the whole country gathered. The message of Pastor Elie Weick titled
